Ms. Rosselot is an adult nurse practitioner specializing in travel health and certified in occupational health. She received graduate degrees in adult primary care nursing and public health from Columbia University. She is a founding member of the American Travel Health Nurses Association (ATHNA) and editor of the ATHNA website www.athna.org. Ms. Rosselot has been active in the International Society of Travel Medicine (ISTM) since its founding, having chaired the Nurses Professional Group. In 2017 Ms. Rosselot was the second recipient of the ISTM Distinguished Nurse Leadership Award. She is a Fellow of AANP, ISTM, ATHNA and the Faculty of Travel Medicine, Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons, University of Glasgow. She has authored sections in the CDC Health Information for International Travel and chapters in the Keystone and Jong travel medicine texts. Ms. Rosselot frequently consults for the CDC Travel Health Branch and has taught courses for the CIA, Smithsonian, the Canadian Federal Government and numerous corporations and U.S. universities.

Early in Gail's career she was a public health nurse, student health service director at Douglass College, a nurse and health educator at Khao-I-Dang refugee camp in Thailand, and a corporate nurse at Bristol-Myers Squibb. Recently she chaired the group that achieved ANA specialty recognition for travel health nursing and developed Travel Health Nursing: Scope and Standards of Practice and the new Code of Ethics of Travel Health Nursing. Currently Ms. Rosselot is a CDC E-Learning Fellow, supervises a contact tracing team in the Hudson Valley, and is co-authoring a chapter in Vaughn and Viera, Principles and Practice of College Health.
